BECOME A YORK LEADER AND ENHANCE YOUR CV


Don't forget to keep an eye on Careers and Placements, and participate in the York Award and York Strengths programmes.

USE YOUR LIBRARY

Talk to your librarians about criticality to learn what is expected from you at your level of study. Ask in the library for archived examples of previous students' dissertations and theses. If you're an international student, the library also offers a range of brilliant supportive services to help you out as well - so check those out!



USE YOUR ACADEMIC SUPPORT NETWORK

The University provides a huge range of support for you, no matter what your level of study is. From 1:1 support meetings, library drop-in hours, workshops and online material from the Math Skills Centre, Writing and Language Skills Centre and digital skills such as coding - it's all there for you!

GET TO GRIPS WITH ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

Academic Integrity and you can also access lots of online

support and examples. The University also gives you free

access to Turnitin to help you avoid plagiarism. Workshops

and online material are available on the University's Virtual

Learning Environment (VLE) which is called Yorkshare.

BOOST YOUR SKILLS!

A useful port of call is the Library's Subject Guides, each of which is designed to help you find information and access materials relevant to your department. Aside from this, there are Skills Guides for help and advice on a range of digital and academic skills.

You can also come along to the Digital Skills Training sessions throughout term, looking at digital tools like Microsoft Office and Google's suite of applications - as well as skills such as critical reading and organisation. There's also Digital Wednesdays sessions where you can explore topics like digital creativity and learning to code!

GET TO KNOW YOUR SUPERVISOR

"Let your supervisor know that you exist! They set up meetings with you for a reason - to check that you're ok. Use these meetings to ask any questions you might have and don't be afraid to tell them if you're not enjoying things. That's what they are there for!"

RECHARGE YOUR BATTERIES




TAKE PART IN ROSES

BE ON TV OR RADIO!










VISIT THE CAMPUS BARS AND FOOD OUTLETS


STARGAZE AT THE ASTROCAMPUS!


EXPLORE YORK!






EXPLORE YORKSHIRE!
